A PATIENT'S STORY

"Susan" initially started coming to The CARE Clinic in 1996 for hypertension, minor illnesses and degenerative joint disease (DJD). As her DJD worsened, she was referred to a specialist who diagnosed her with ankylosing spondylitis or rheumatoid inflammation of the vertebral joints. She continued to be treated at the clinic and by the specialist, but over the years, the condition became so bad that she could not stand up straight and had trouble walking. During one of her clinic visits, it was determined that she needed hospital care.

At the hospital, tests were run and surgery was performed to remove a cyst on her spine. Susan also received help in applying for and receiving Medicaid. In order to complete her recovery, Susan was sent to a rehabilitation facility.

Susan called recently to report that she is doing well. She expressed her sincere gratitude to The CARE Clinic, which she feels helped her when it seemed there was no place else to go.

Farewell to Canadian Volunteer



As so often happens in a military town such as Fayetteville, The CARE Clinic recently lost a valued dental volunteer, Yvon Saulnier, DDS, to relocation. This relocation was not to another American military post, however. Dr. Saulnier and his family have returned to Canada, their home country, after spending two years in the area.

Dr. Saulnier and his family initially came to Fayetteville when his wife, Capt. Debra Carter, a dentist in the Canadian military, was accepted to a post-graduate training program at Ft. Bragg. The training, which would enable Dr. Carter to become a general dentistry specialist, is only available in the United States.

Because the conditions of Dr. Saulnier's visa precluded him from seeking or obtaining employment, he primarily spent his time looking after his family. But in order to keep up his skills, Dr. Saulnier began investigating doing volunteer dentistry. After several false starts—volunteer jobs that required him to be a U.S. citizen, or to have a dental license he could not obtain—he found that he could volunteer at The CARE Clinic simply by obtaining a permit from the North Carolina State Dental Board and reinstating his Canadian dental license, which he had let lapse after moving to the United States.

Working at The CARE Clinic proved to be mutually beneficial, adding an extra staff member to the perpetually short list of dental volunteers, and giving Dr. Saulnier the hours he needed to maintain his licensure. "They appreciated the extra help," he says. "A lot of people put in long days, assistants and dentists alike, and they have to make their way to a facility to extract teeth, which is not something everyone looks forward to after a long day. I tip my hat to them."

Dr. Saulnier and his family have returned to Nova Scotia, their home province, where he hopes to continue devoting some time to locum tenens work in under-served areas after he adjusts to his new working arrangement.

"I count myself fortunate that I was able to work at The CARE Clinic," he says. "It fit in well with my philosophy. To deal with someone who's had a bad experience in the past and will get up out of the chair and say "Thank you very much; you did a good a job," that's where I hope to be for the rest of my career."

The CARE Clinic Nutrition Series
