A GOLDEN GIFT

BG (Ret) Joseph and Charlotte Nagel recently commemorated their 50th Wedding Anniversary in a very special way by generously sponsoring the kitchen in our new clinic. BG (Ret) Nagel has been an active member of The CARE Clinic family for over 16 years. He served as a member of the original steering committee that

helped develop the clinic and has continuously served in various roles since, including serving as Board President in 2001-2002. We are honored the Nagels chose The CARE Clinic's named gift opportunity as a way of providing enduring recognition of their golden wedding anniversary while benefiting the work of The CARE Clinic.

MARP UPDATE

In June of 2005, The CARE Clinic began using Medication Access and Review Program software which was designed to help manage free medication orders for North Carolina residents who are uninsured or underinsured. The MARP database helps with the ever-changing process of searching for no-cost medications, determining patients' eligibility, completing applications, tracking requests and reminding the user when it is time to reorder patients' medications.

Prior to receiving MARP, volunteers ordered medications for patients using software that had been developed and set up at the clinic years before by a clinic volunteer, John Reichart, to help track medication orders. It was quite helpful in some ways but it did not have the scope that MARP has. It would have taken days to order all the drugs that we can now order in hours with MARP. MARP not only keeps track of when to reorder a patient's meds, but also keeps track of personal information including address, income, and which

medications that patient requires, including strength and dosing information. The program currently has links to the forms from 146 different drug companies. There are 3,092 medications available from these companies, and the data is updated on a regular basis.

Currently, staff member Gina Saragosa and one CARE Clinic volunteer handle ordering medications for our MARP patients. In the first four months after the program was installed, there were 45 patients enrolled. By the end of that first quarter, 184 medications had been received for a savings of over \$13,000. As of September 29, 2008, there are 59 active patients. Many of these patients require numerous medications to help them stay healthy and productive. Most of them require drugs for asthma and allergies, which can be quite expensive. Many of the types of inhalers these patients need cost several hundred dollars for a ninety day supply. In the last quarter alone, there were 66 new requests for medications. One hundred forty nine medications were received for a total cost of \$54,020.32. Since the inception of the program, 123 different patients have received medication through MARP and 2,574 prescriptions have been filled, saving the clinic and its patients almost \$600,000. The CARE Clinic can offer help to numerous patients who couldn't afford their medicines because of this helpful program.

YOUTH DEANERY SERVICE PROJECT



On Friday, October 3, 2008 the Good Shepherd Catholic Church High School Youth Group held their annual deanery project which included a lock-in and dance. The lock-in is a sleep over at the church which leads up to the service project.

Every year Good Shepherd selects a place to perform needed voluntary service. This year The CARE Clinic was selected. Some of the other youth stayed back at the church and helped paint, clean, and prepare lunches for the other youth.

On Saturday, October 4th, high school and middle school youth group members came out to The CARE Clinic on Robeson Street in Fayetteville for their Deanery Service Project. About twenty youth came and cleaned up the grounds around the clinic. They helped assemble and prepare a letter for a mass mailing, and took time to assemble medical and dental charts for patients. The youth also donated items listed on The CARE Clinic's wish list to help restock needed supplies. After a few hours of service, the youth went to Festival Park to enjoy a nice old-fashioned picnic.
